Chairman's report:

This year we ran one indoor and six outdoor contests. This was one less than last year as Hawick was cancelled.

We also ran a successful structured learning course with twenty-two candidates taking the exam in April. This was the very first course run under the new Piping and Drumming Qualification Board, and we had an excellent success rate of 96%. My thanks this year to our two new instructors John Connor and Bill Black for their

commitment and determination to get the candidates ready.

This year was a little lean for the Branch in terms of success at the Majors. The exception being the Juvenile Grade where the Branch took first and second spot, with George Watson's College topping the table and second place going to Boghall & Bathgate Caledonia, and the Grade 1 Drumming award which went to Boghall & Bathgate Caledonia.

Secretary's report:

I have enjoyed my first year as secretary and found the position to be quite a challenge at times but also very enjoyable and rewarding. I think that everything went well at all the contests this season and I would like to thank everyone for their help and support.

It is now time to start working towards next season and we have already started working on next seasons events including the Structured Learning course and the Indoor Contests.

All the contest dates for next season have been confirmed with the exception of the Indoor Contest. We have had confirmation that the Hawick contest will not go ahead this year again.

I am sure with the continued hard work and support of the committee and also the bands themselves we will continue to have the success that the Branch has had in recent years.

<u>Treasurer's report</u>:

The Treasurer presented an account of the Branch funds and asked for any questions regarding them.

National Council report:

There had been a number of long meetings throughout the year and a lot of business had been done, but the National Council is becoming more structured and efficient with it's business.

There are a good number of sub committee reports that are presented at the meetings, and we do our best to distil this information at the Branch meetings.

Music Board report:

The Championship criteria are reversed for 2008. So if you played an MSR last year in say the Scottish, you will play a medley in 2008 at the same contest.

The Worlds Grade 2 split (28 bands). It has been reported by the Music Board that no Music board members were consulted. However this statement was contested by G Purves and will be discussed at the National Council meeting on 1st December. Music Board members must be involved prior to any decisions.

PBQB update. Instructor's course starting January 2008. Branches to forward names to headquarters.

Pipe band studies, well advanced but still one or two points to overcome.

Regradings are subject to National Council approval.

The Music Board would like the Chief Executive Officer and two National Councillors to facilitate Adjudicators allocations for all contests.

The Music Board will produce a document on Competition Procedures.

The MAP contest now has three tunes and the timings will remain the same.

Education report:

The Branch ran a Level 2 PDQB course at which nineteen sat and all passed.

This was the first time any organisation had run the exams under PDQB syllabus. As a result there were a few differences from the RSPBA Structured Learning exams.

A level 3 or 4 course will start either February or March next year. Pibroch will be included this time, with a Ground and one variation for Level 3 and a full Pibroch for Level 4.

A venue is still to be found for the courses.

When questioned on the detail of the exam results it was explained that only a pass or fail was given. No further breakdown of the exams could be given.

Trophy Convenor's report:

By the end of the season bands were returning trophies on time. All trophies must be returned at least four weeks prior to the contest they are for. Bands failing to do so risk disqualification and fines.

Election of Office Bearers:

At this time Kevin Reilly took the chair to oversee the elections.

Honoraria:

Book of Eminence:

It was asked the Gordon Blaikie be included in this book. Teresa Clarke to provide some background on Gordon.

A.O.C.B.:

The Branch website now mimics the R.S.P.B.A. site and has had 4 million "hits". The advertiser's fees now cover the cost of the website

The Branch will have been in existence for 70 years on January 2009. It was asked if the Branch might do something to celebrate this milestone.

At this time the Kevin Reilly gave the Branch a very interesting and informed plan/slide show on how we might like to see the Association move forward over the next 75 years. There was much debate and many questions were asked. The questions will all be answered once all the other Branches have had a chance to hear Kevin's talk.
